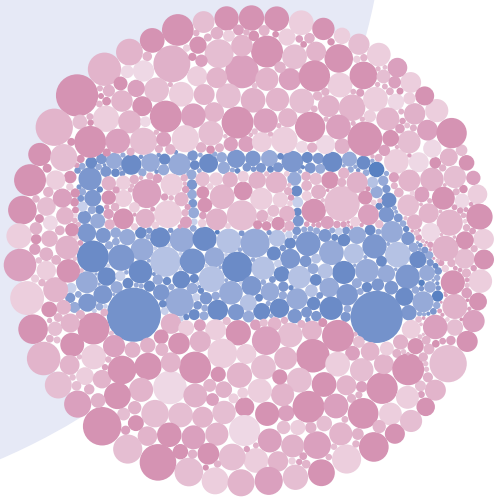

VANPOOLS MAKE LONG DISTANCE COMMUTES EASY

A van pool is a group of 7 to 15 people who commute together in a van. One person usually serves as a driver/coordinator and handles routine maintenance. Riders pay a monthly fee that covers commuting expenses.

A VANPOOL COMMUTE COULD BE THE RIGHT MOVE IF YOU...

- Travel at least 15 miles one-way to work
- Maintain a consistent work schedule
- Live and work near other people who would like to share the ride

SOUNDS GOOD—SO WHAT DOES IT COST?

Riders pay a monthly fare based on the cost of the vanpool commute. Vanpool fares vary depending on the type of van, features, accessories, commute distance and number of riders. The average monthly cost for most vanpools is \$70–\$120 per person per month, far less than commuting alone.

IT GETS BETTER! REBATES AND INCENTIVES

New riders and vanpools may qualify for tax breaks, rebates and incentives that can significantly reduce the commuting costs.
