Go Metro To Dodger Stadium

Take advantage of a winning combination again this season to enjoy LA Dodger home games. Just Go Metro to Union Station and connect with the Dodger Stadium Express. You won't have to fight traffic and you'll help reduce air pollution.

The Dodger Stadium Express leaves Patsaouras Transit Plaza at Union Station every 10 minutes, starting 90 minutes before game time; return service runs until 45 minutes after the final out. Your same-day Dodger ticket is good for the fare*; otherwise, regular Metro fares apply.

The Dodger Stadium Express is made possible by Clean Transportation Funding from the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC), which has removed 20 million pounds of harmful pollutants from the air through various programs to reduce air pollution over the past 21 years. Plan to leave your car at home and connect with the Dodger Stadium Express for all Dodger home games.

** Please note that same-day Dodger tickets are good for fare on the Dodger Stadium Express only. Regular fares apply on all other connecting bus and rail service.*

K-12 Student Passes Converting To TAP

All Metro reduced-fare student paper passes are being converted to TAP, the electronic fare card that is now in use by all other Metro reduced-fare groups. Metro has already completed the conversion of reduced-fare College, Senior and Disabled customers to TAP.

Students in kindergarten through 12th grade are eligible for the reduced-fare TAP program. TAP cards help speed boarding and are kinder to the environment than traditional paper passes. Another benefit of TAP for students is that a lost card may be replaced if they opt for balance protection. Get \$2 Off New LA Plaza de Cultura y Artes In Downtown LA

Discover LA's rich historical roots and Go Metro to get \$2 off admission when you show your valid Metro pass or Metro Rail ticket as *LA Plaza de Cultura y Artes* (LA Plaza) opens April 16 in Downtown LA.

Adjacent to the Olvera Street marketplace and El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historical Monument where LA was founded in 1781, the Mexican American cultural center is housed within the newly renovated Vickrey-Brunswick Building and Plaza House on Main Street. The center also includes 30,000 square feet of garden.

The inaugural exhibit, *LA Starts Here!*, shows the role of Mexicans and Mexican Americans in the founding and shaping of LA's history and culture from the city's founding to the present.

CicLAvia Returns To LA Streets April 10

Some seven miles of LA city streets will be closed to car traffic and open to pedestrians and cyclists on April 10 from 10am to 3pm as *CicLAvia* returns.

CicLAvia creates a temporary, 45-acre public park for residents to come walk, bicycle, jog and enjoy outdoor activities in a unique recreation space. The route stretches from Boyle Heights, through Downtown and MacArthur Park, to East Hollywood, connecting some of the city's most park-poor neighborhoods and diverse communities.
