Call for Projects



What is Metro's Call for Projects?

Funding program for projects and programs within Los Angeles County.

“Competitive process by which various federal, state, and local transportation funds are awarded to the most “regionally significant projects.”

Funds are programmed over 5 years.



Who can apply in Metro's Call for Projects?

Public agencies that provide transportation facilities or services within L A County.

- Cities
- County
- Caltrans
- Joint Powers Authority (JPA) if sponsored by the above.



7 Travel Modes Funded in CFP

Regional Surface Transportation Improvements (RSTI)	Road improvements and goods movement projects on regionally significant arterials that improve traffic flow and reduce congestion.
Signal Synchronization & Bus Speed Improvements	Traffic signal synchronization, transit preferential treatment and priority systems, intersection improvements, ITS.
Transportation Demand Management (TDM)	Technology and/or innovation-based strategies
Bikeway Improvements	Projects that provide access and mobility through bike-to-transit improvements, gap closures, bicycle parking.
Pedestrian Improvements	Projects that promote walking, pedestrian safety and link to overall transportation system.
Transit Capital	Bus improvements, construction of transit stations, transit centers, park and ride lots, commuter rail stations and transit vehicle purchases.
Transportation Enhancement Activities (TEA)	Landscaping, historic preservation, control or removal of outdoor advertising, environmental mitigation, safety education for bicycles and pedestrians, etc.



Call for Projects – Bikeway Mode



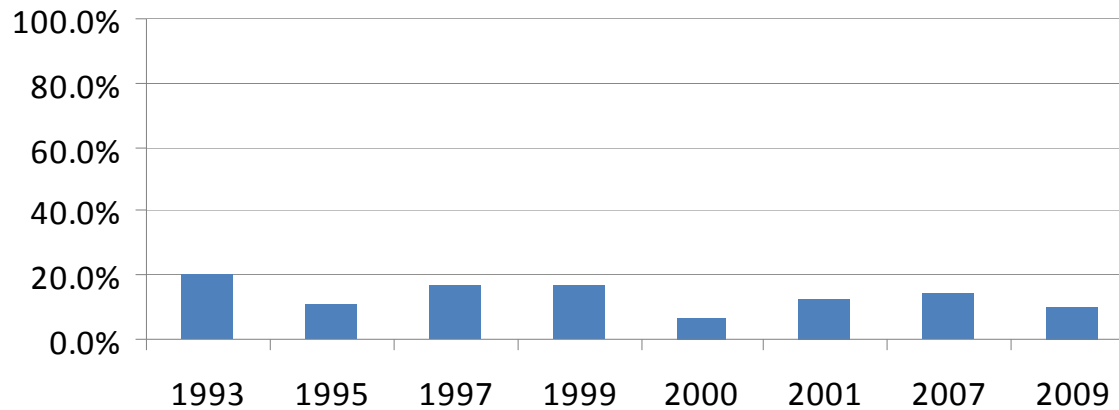
Types of projects funded:

- Bicycle parking (racks & lockers)
 - Membership-based attended or unattended bicycle parking stations
 - On-street improvements to increase bicycle access to transit at transit hubs
-
- Bike sharing programs
 - Wayfinding and directional signage
 - Well designed mid-block crossing improvements
 - First-time bike racks on municipal buses
 - Bicycle boulevards
 - Road diets
 - Sharrows on designated bike routes
 - Bike lanes or bike paths

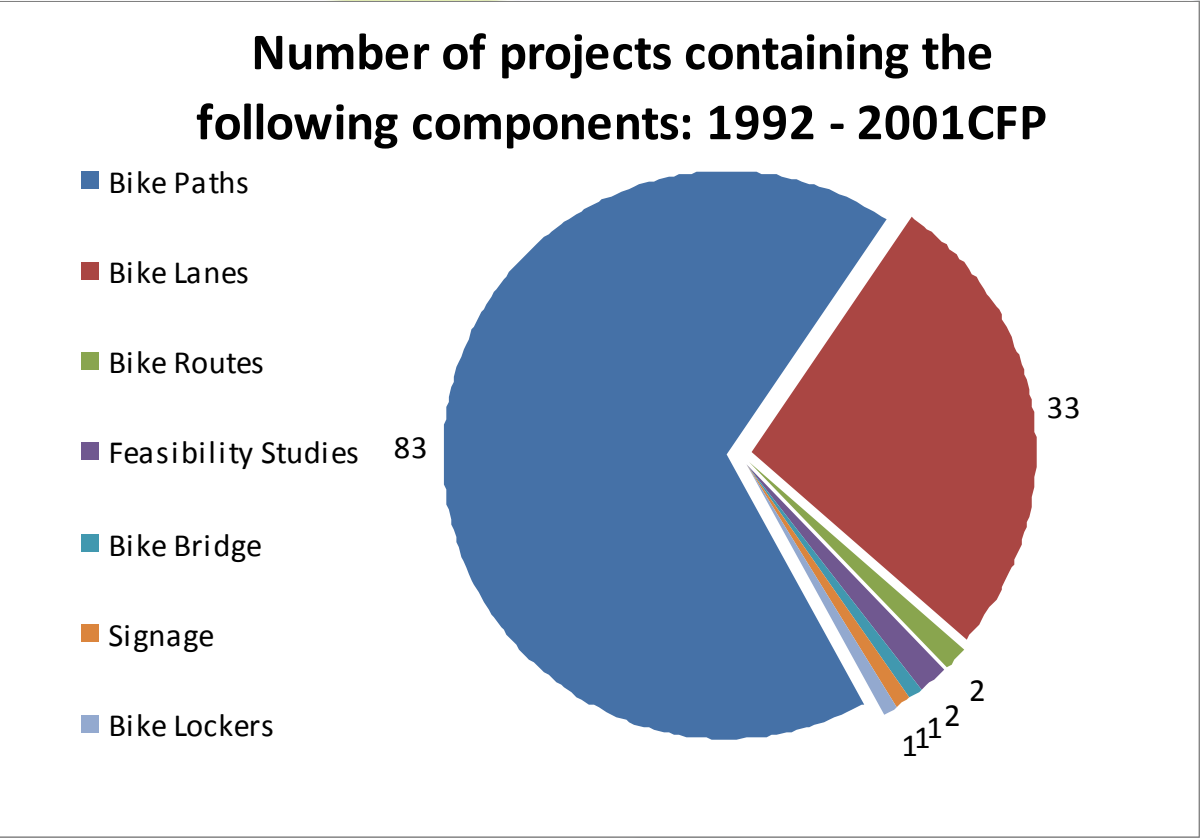


Cities Sponsoring Bike Projects

Categories of Bike Projects Funded in Call

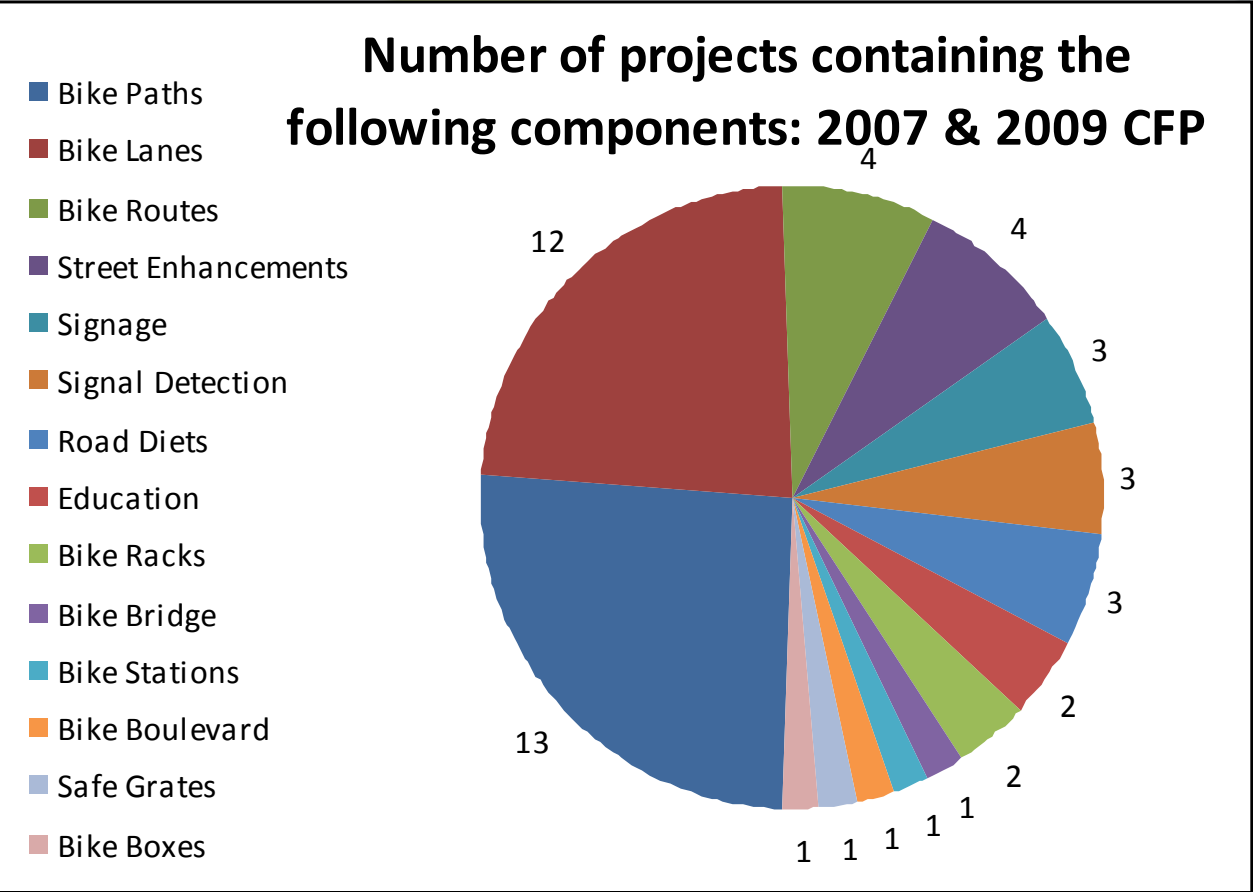


Total bike mode projects: 109

Number of projects containing the following components: 2007 & 2009 CFP



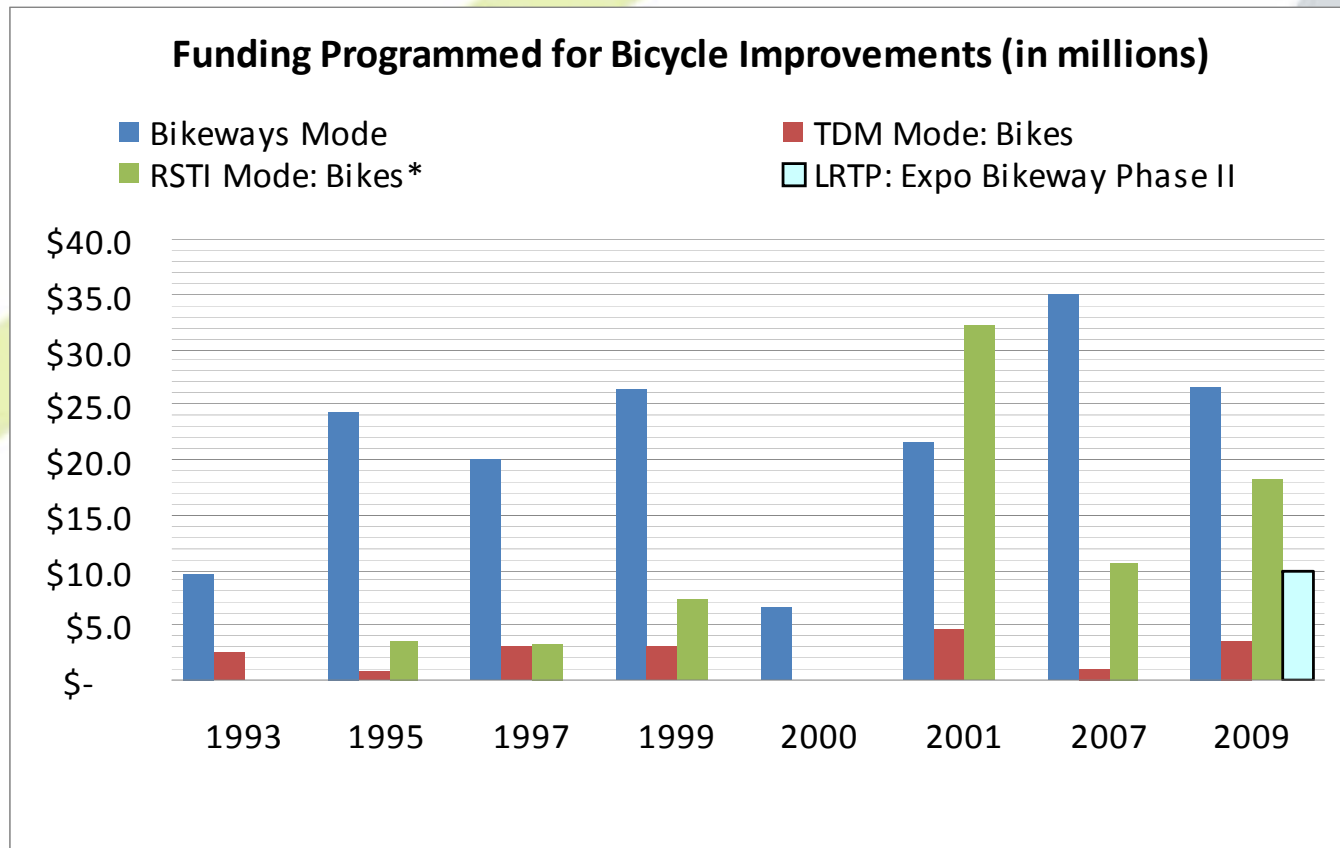

Total combined funding for Bike and TDM mode: \$188 million

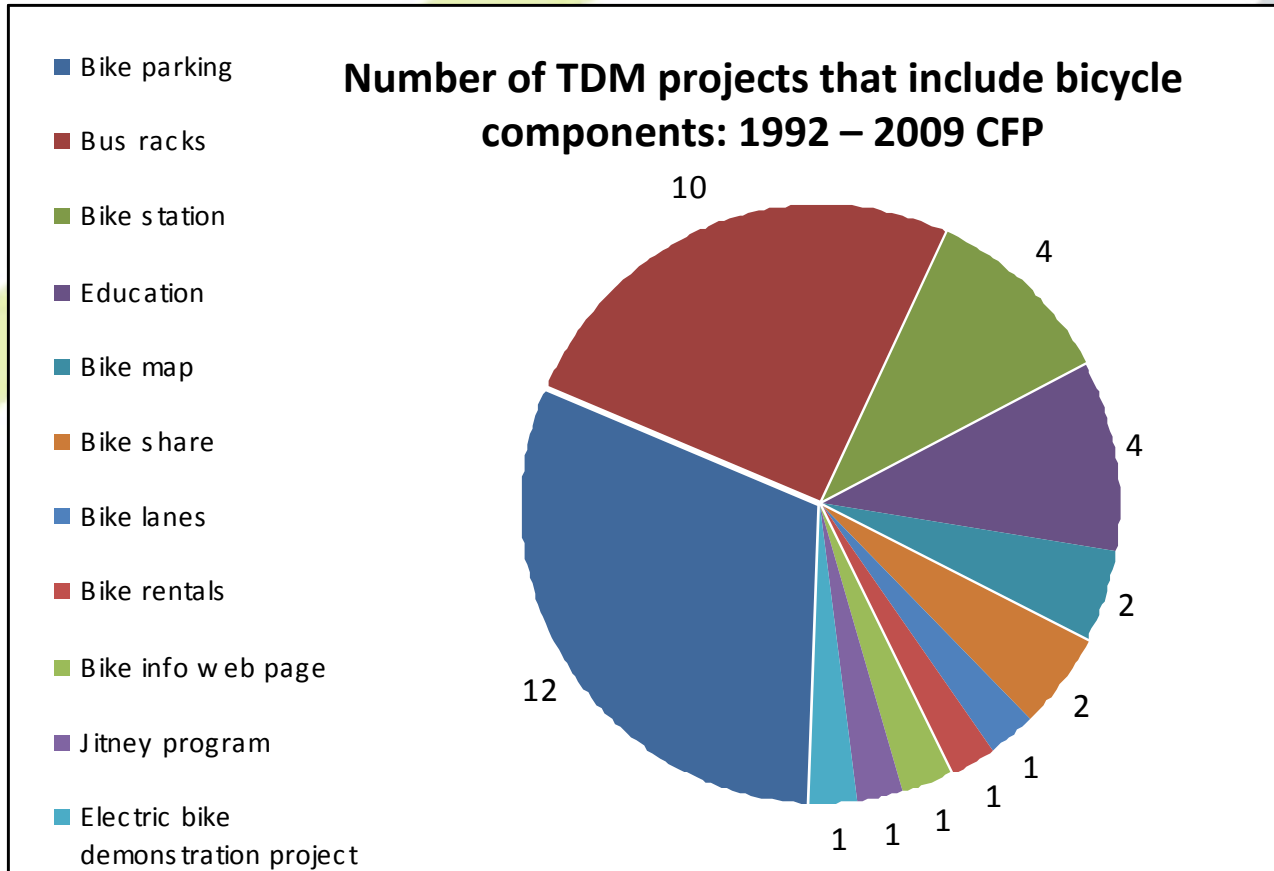
