ESFV LRT Project Overview

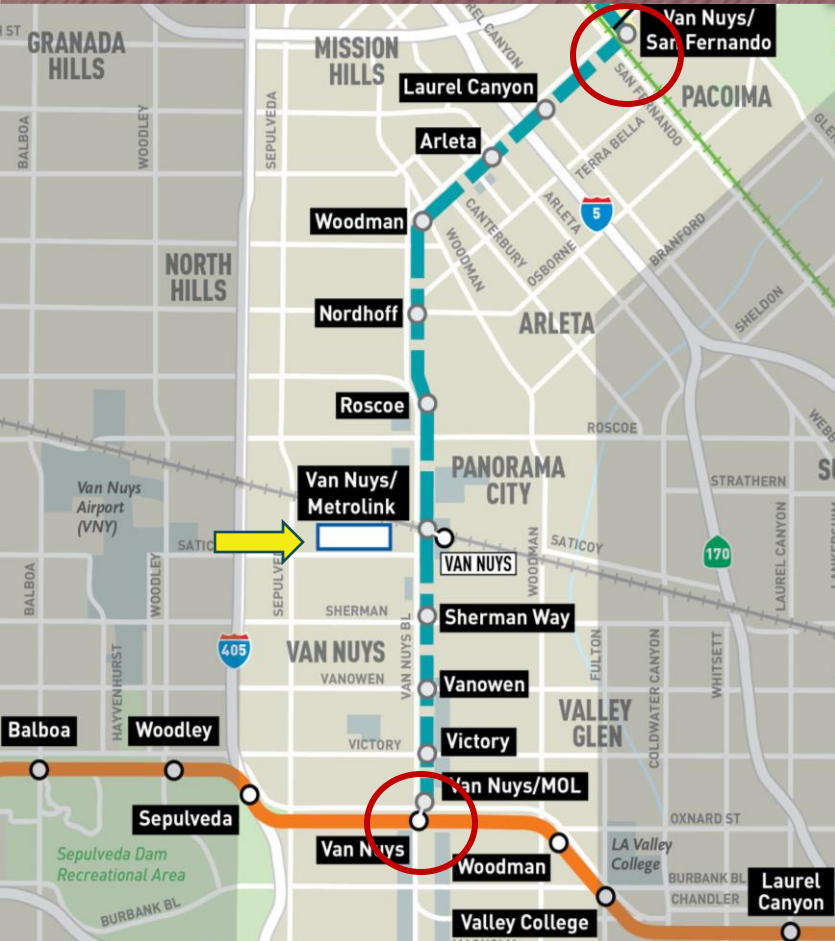
2020: Metro Board certified Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR)

2021: Metro achieved Record of Decision (ROD) for Final Environmental Impact Study (EIS)

- Allowed for the 9.2-mile line to be built in two segments
 - Southern Segment: 6.7-mile Light Rail Transit from Van Nuys/Metro G Line to Van Nuys/San Fernando.
 - Northern Segment: 2.5-mile from Van Nuys Bl/San Fernando Rd to Sylmar/San Fernando Metrolink.



ESFV Southern Segment



- **Southern Segment** will connect the Metro G Line (Orange) to San Fernando Road as a center-median guideway on Van Nuys Boulevard
- **Southern Segment** will include
 - 6.7 miles of light rail
 - 11 new at-grade transit stations
 - 10 Traction Power Substations (TPSS)
 - 1 new Maintenance & Storage Facility (MSF)
 - Utility relocations
 - Street improvements, including bus stops, street trees, and street lights
- Anticipated Completion: 2030

ESFV Northern Segment



- Following the certification of the East San Fernando Valley (ESFV) LRT Project Final EIS/EIR, the Metro Board directed staff to prepare an additional study for a second phase that could include further changes to the northern 2.5-miles segment of the project located within the Antelope Valley Metrolink/UPRR shared ROW.
- The ESFV Shared ROW Study is currently underway and includes grade crossing analysis, conceptual design, and analysis for up to three concepts not studied in the Final EIS/EIR.
- The Study is anticipated to be completed in mid-2024

Transforming the Corridor

Transforming the corridor to enhance transit service and accessibility:



Improve connections to and access between Van Nuys and Pacoima for commuters, travelers, and Equity Focus Communities.



Provide direct access to Metrolink and G Line stations, promoting local and regional travel.



Maintain full access at key intersecting arterials.

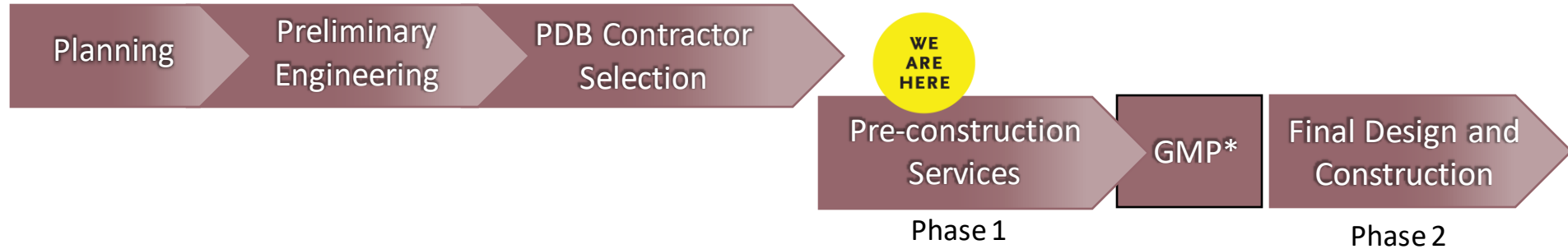

Progressive Design Build Contractor (PDB)

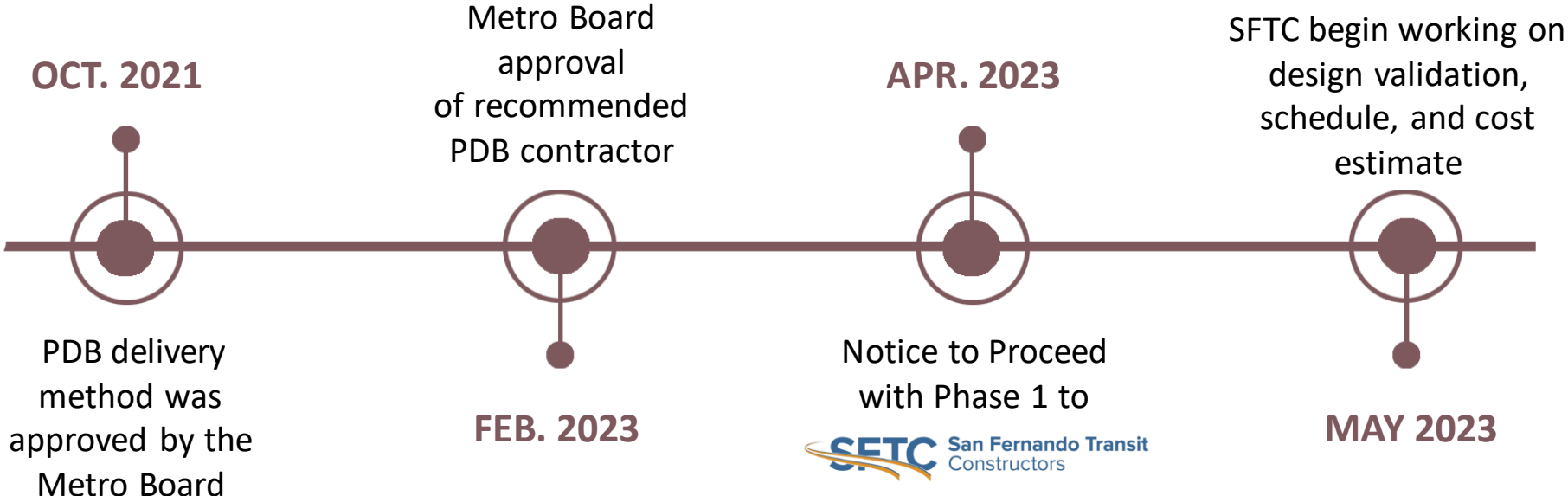


- PDB delivery method is a collaborative process between Metro, PDB (contractor and designer), and Third Parties (City of LA, DWP, County, etc.).
- PDB delivery method brings the contractor and their designer into the project early to allow for discussion of innovative and value engineering ideas.
- Once Metro and the PDB reach an agreement on scope and cost, they will work with Metro and Third Parties to advance the design further and then proceed with major construction.

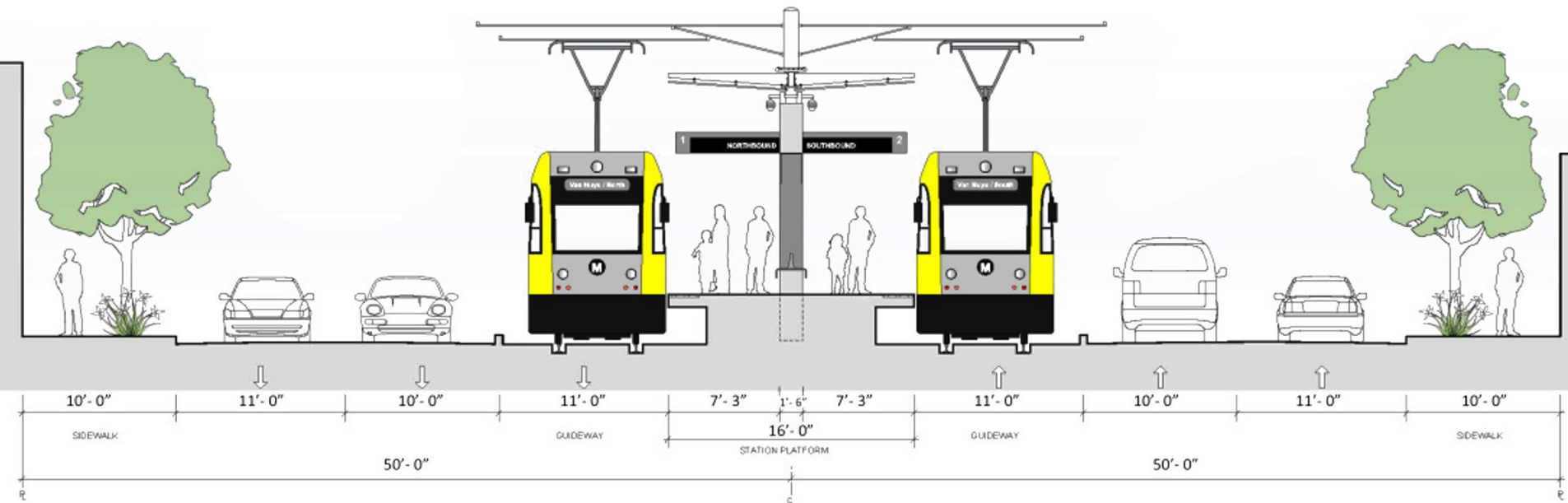

Completed Pre-Construction Work

- Utility Investigations
 - Work included detection, marking and confirming underground utilities
 - Street pavement repair and striping restoration after investigation work
- Underground Exploration
 - Work included soil boring, pavement coring, and street pavement restoration
 - Identification of sensitive materials such as underground wells, lead, drywells, etc.

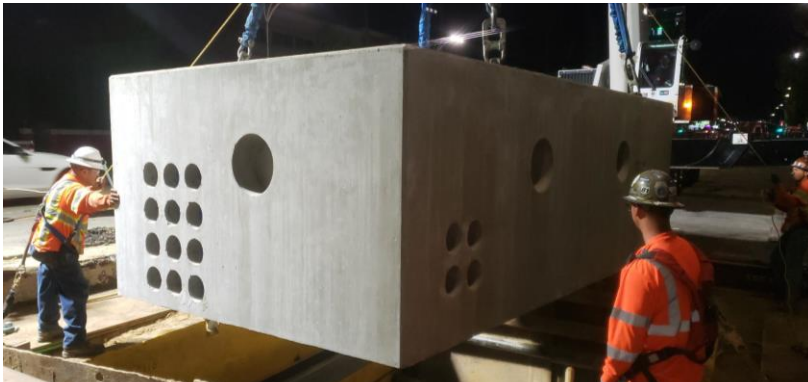

Early Construction Activities: Advanced Utility Adjustment (AUA)

What

- Relocation of LADWP underground facilities, which includes utility investigation, vault installation, duct bank installation, and pavement restoration.
- Activities include traffic control set up, saw cutting and excavation.



Vault installation along Van Nuys Bl between Vanowen St and Vose St

When

- Work activity began February 2023 and is anticipated for completion January/February 2024.
- LADWP cable installation to follow and scheduled through Fall 2024.

Where

- Along Van Nuys Bl between Vose St and Vanowen St.

Progress

- Ongoing duct bank installation.
- 3 of 4 vaults have been installed.

Future Construction Activities

- San Fernando Transit Constructors (SFTC) field investigation and utility relocation work anticipated to begin in late 2023.
- Current design will advance to Final design in 2024.
- Ongoing coordination with Third Party Agencies, including City of LA, LADWP, County, etc.
- Construction schedules and work will be coordinated.

Real Estate Acquisition

- Metro's Real Estate Department supports the ESFV LRT by planning, acquiring, and delivering property within the approved Project area for construction and operations.
- Real Estate works with property owners and occupants to implement state and federal acquisition and relocation programs.
- Real estate activities have begun on Maintenance & Storage Facility (MSF) parcels and the appraisal and acquisition process is ongoing. This include the appraisal of property, furniture, fixtures, and equipment.
- Once the property's fair market value is established, an offer of just compensation will be made to the property owner.
- In the coming months, a Relocation Plan for the ESFV LRT will be posted for comment and review at a public location (such as a local library) for 30 days. Public notification will be circulated.
- Relocation benefits will be offered to help businesses and residents displaced by the acquisition.



Real Estate Acquisition: Anticipated Timeline

2023

March - May

Ongoing appraisal preparation on Maintenance & Storage Facility (MSF) parcels.

Interviews with businesses and residents displaced by acquisition being conducted.

June

Continue appraisal preparation.

Appraisal task orders to appraise 3 Traction Power Substation site parcels awarded.

July - August

Initial appraisals expected to be reviewed

Initial offers anticipated to go out on MSF parcels.

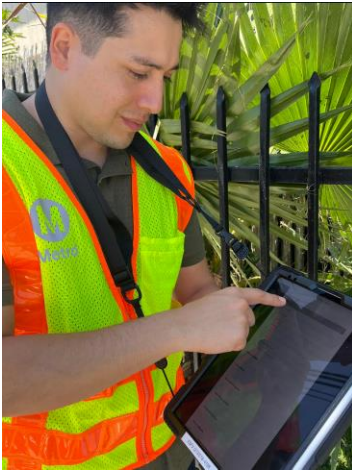
August - September

Continue initial offers for MSF parcels.

Relocation Plan anticipated to be released for public comment. Public notification will be circulated.



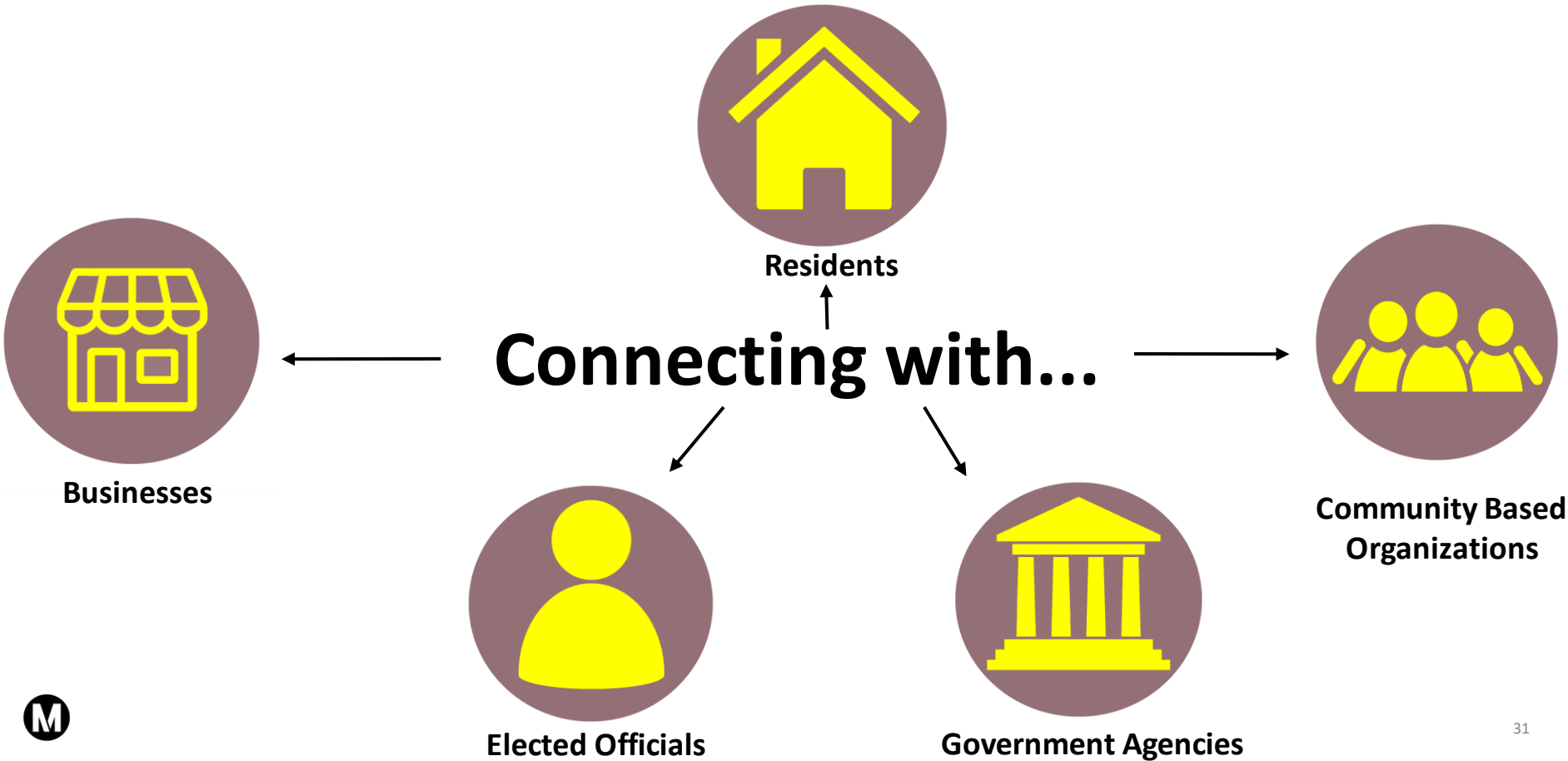


SUMMARY
As part of the East San Fernando Valley Light Rail Transit Project, Metro's contractor, W.A. Rasic Construction Co., Inc., will perform advance utility work activities ahead of major construction. This work will be conducted along Van Nuys Bl from Vanowen St to Hart St and will include excavations, vault installation, repaving of roadway, and sidewalk repair. This work will be performed on weekdays and weekends.

Weekdays from 9:00am to 3:30pm & 8:00pm to 6:00am (weather permitting)
Weekends from 8:00am to 6:00pm (weather permitting)
Work is expected to start in mid-February and be complete by late fall 2023.

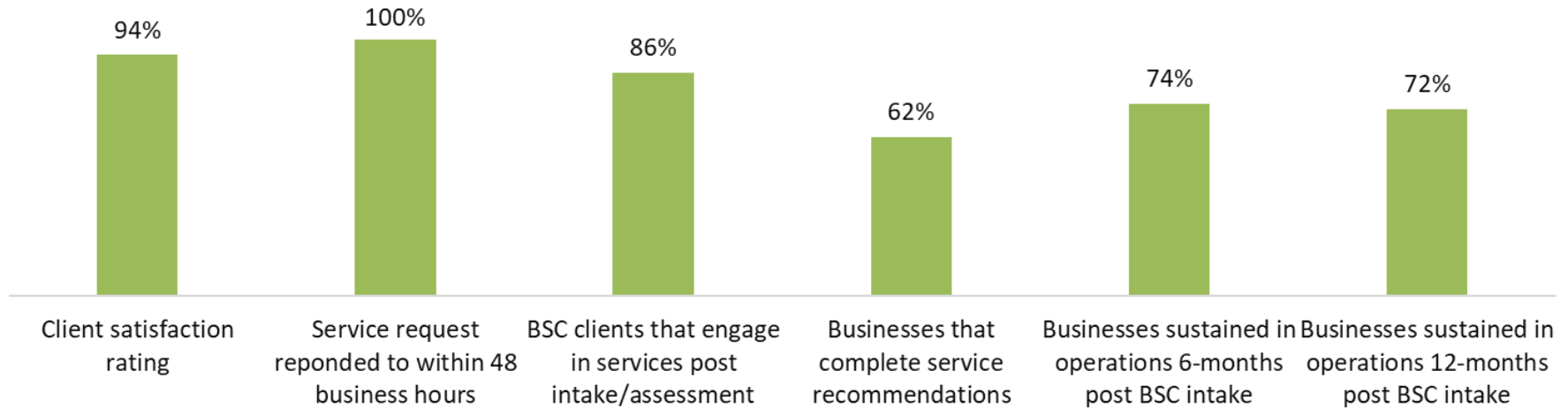

Pilot Business Interruption Fund (BIF)

Helping small “mom and pop” businesses continue to thrive throughout construction and post construction.

Metro’s Business Interruption Fund (BIF) provides financial assistance to small “mom & pop” businesses directly impacted by Metro transit rail construction along four project areas:

- Crenshaw/LAX Transit Project
- Purple Line Extension, Sections 1, 2 & 3
- Regional Connector Project, Little Tokyo area & 2nd/Broadway Segment*
- **East San Fernando Valley Light Rail Transit Project**

Metro’s goal is to help small businesses continue to thrive throughout construction and post construction. The BIF is a demonstration of Metro’s commitment to being a trusted community builder, partner and stakeholder.



*Segment eligibility based on full street closure with duration greater than six continuous months. Eligibility ended 6/30/17.

Pilot Business Interruption Fund (BIF)

BIF Information and Eligibility

- Businesses must have 25 or fewer full-time employees
- Businesses must be located immediately adjacent to the rail corridor and meet other eligibility requirements
- Grant amounts are determined by business revenue loss directly related to period of Metro construction disruption
- Businesses may receive up to \$60,000 per impact year
- New Presumptive Eligibility Grant Award
 - Businesses that have limited documentation regarding business operations and financials may apply for a Presumptive Eligibility grant award which is a one-time annual award of \$1,500.
 - The business must be able to meet the standard eligibility requirements and be impacted by direct construction activity.

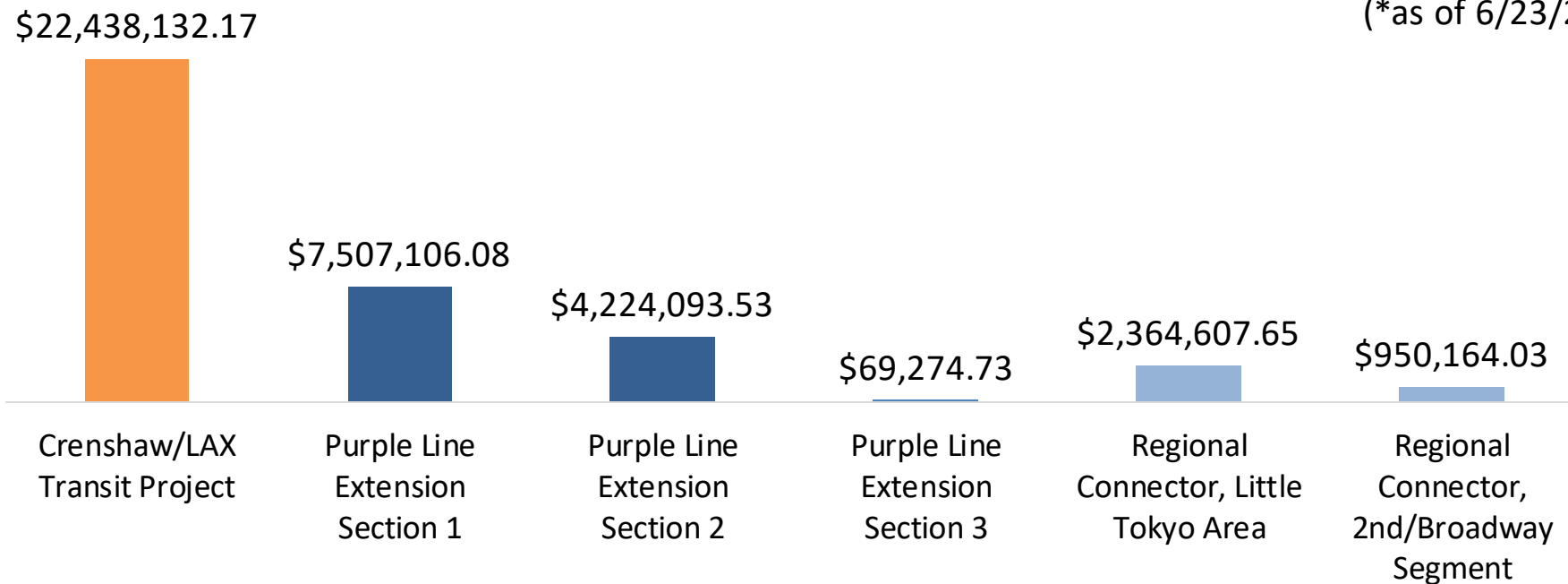

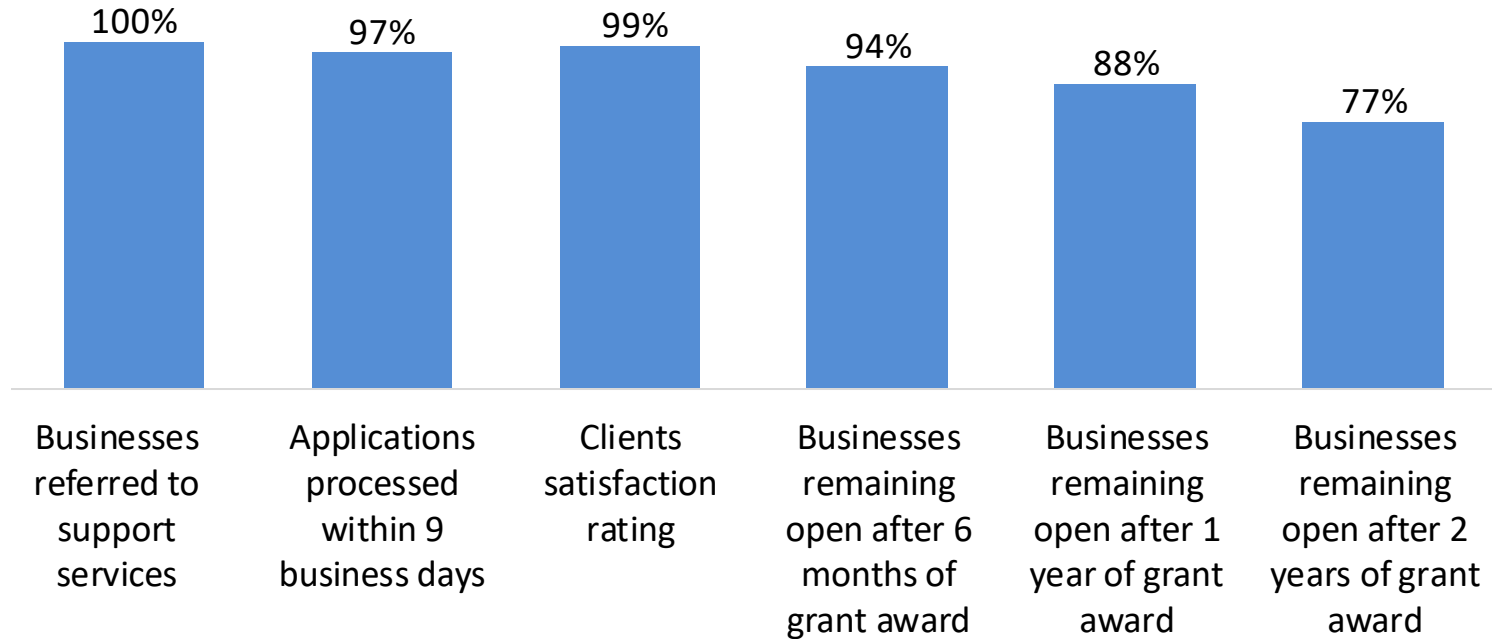
