## A New Vision for the Corridor

Metro has a plan to invest in transportation-related improvements throughout the Long Beach-East Los Angeles (LB-ELA) Corridor that provide safe, quality travel options for moving people and goods.

The LB-ELA Corridor includes 18 cities and communities: Bell, Bellflower, Bell Gardens, Carson, Commerce, Compton, Cudahy, Downey, Huntington Park, Lakewood, Long Beach, Lynwood, Maywood, Paramount, Signal Hill, South Gate, Vernon, Wilmington, East Los Angeles, Boyle Heights, San Pedro, East/Rancho Dominguez and Walnut Park.

## Partnering with Communities

In fall 2021, Metro partnered with diverse community and regional stakeholders along this important corridor and formed a Task Force in response to communities who voiced the need for a different vision for the LB-ELA Corridor that would not widen the freeway or displace homes and businesses. Since its inception, the Task Force has been engaged in a rigorous process supporting the development of a draft Investment Plan that identifies a recommended list of multimodal strategies for improving the quality of life and mobility options for the communities of this corridor.

The Task Force is advised by a Community Leadership Committee, a Coordinating Committee and three working groups that meet regularly. Members include residents, public health advocates, environmental groups, community-based organizations, labor unions, freight and business associations, educators, agencies, and local elected officials.

## Draft Investment Plan

As a result of the Task Force process, Metro has partnered with local community stakeholders to develop the draft Long Beach-East LA Corridor Mobility Investment Plan (Investment Plan) that identifies, prioritizes, budgets, and plans for needed transportation improvements.

The draft Investment Plan leverages about \$730 million in sales tax revenue to secure additional state and federal funding that will help build transportation projects and programs that are needed in the communities between Long Beach and East LA.

The draft Investment Plan includes a prioritized list of projects and programs, which have been evaluated as having

the most strategic impact for enhancing the movement of people and goods through the project corridor. These projects include improvements to active transportation, local roadways, community programs, goods movement, transit, and other mobility options.

## Prioritizing Local and Regional Needs

The draft Investment Plan is intended to optimize the transportation investment that will be made in the LB-ELA Corridor to ensure that communities along the corridor equitably benefit from the proposed investments.

The draft Investment Plan provides an overall vision and strategic guidance for local jurisdictions to use as a reference as they develop and implement their own economic development and mobility strategies. This information will support areas in transforming into a safer and more accessible via multiple modes of mobility.

## Review Draft Investment Plan
