- > The meeting included a recap of the Task Force and Working Groups, CLC members participated in an interactive dot activity, and then concluded with next steps and upcoming meetings.

# Equity Working Group #13 – Highlights

## EWG #13 - Equity Planning and Evaluation Tool (EPET) Workshop

- > Virtual Meeting – Thursday, June 29, 5-7 PM
  - Refresher on EPET purpose and structure
  - Reviewed the detailed outline of EPET documentation content
  - Interactive workshop on Community History & Engagement sections for the EPET and Draft Investment Plan
  - Provided input on the following questions:
    - What do we know about the communities in the LB-ELA Corridor, particularly any marginalized groups, and their history, relationship, or previous engagement with Metro?
    - What historic investments, decisions, events, developments, or disinvestment strategies have contributed to current community conditions in the LB-ELA Corridor and how have they been considered in developing the investment plan?
    - Who are the LB-ELA Corridor community members most vulnerable to negative impacts and/or living in historically marginalized or neglected areas that are affected by the investment plan?

# Combined Task Force and CLC Meeting – Part 1 Highlights

- Featured comments by Metro CEO Stephanie Wiggins and Metro Board Member Fernando Dutra acknowledging the efforts of the Task Force, CLC, and Working Group members, to undertake this effort as part of the 7/10 Day of Appreciation.
- Reviewed the updated Project Timeline and Schedule to complete the draft Investment Plan by November 2023
- Reviewed the first batch of qualitative evaluation findings for 6 example projects
- Participated in roundtable discussions to discuss the first batch of qualitative evaluation findings for 6 example projects
- Provided feedback from the roundtable discussions that may inform re-evaluation and/or slight changes to the evaluation results:
  - Input needs to be documented so it is not forgotten during implementation
  - Personal safety is of paramount concern
  - Collaboration with other agencies and cities is important, such as the LA River project
  - Concerns about prioritization

# Combined Task Force and CLC Meeting – Part 2 Highlights

- > Continued the conversation from the Combined Task Force and CLC Meeting - Part 1 on the qualitative evaluation process
  - Reviewed and discussed overall themes in the results
  - Discussed evaluation criteria outputs and results
  - Answered any questions about the qualitative evaluation process and results
  - Project Team provided entire list of projects and qualitative results.
  - Task Force and CLC Members focused discussions on projects of choice and criteria in breakout sessions
    - Strategies for addressing heat island effects
    - Clarification of qualitative evaluation scoring
    - Concerns about sensitive receptors

## Key Questions

**When will projects with adverse impacts be shared?**

**Projects with adverse impacts will be shared in mid-August, 2023.**

# What is the difference between Not Applicable “N/A” and “No benefit”?

If a project is unable to affect or address the evaluation criteria, it receives an N/A.

If a project has the ability to address the evaluation criteria, but doesn't or may have an adverse impact, it would receive a 'no benefit'.

# Key Questions

**Why are we evaluating projects that are not well defined and in the first stage of development? Can more information or facts sheets be provided on every project? Should the projects that are not well defined be taken out of the Investment Plan?**

**Some of the projects in the Project List are in the early planning stages, and do not have additional information available at this time. Some projects may be updated if information becomes available. All projects in the list have potential to address project goals and principles. Because this is a long-term Plan, it is important to include projects that have the potential to improve conditions in the future. Projects that are not well defined may not be prioritized as a "Tier 1" project.**
