Applications due by February 11, 2020

In addition, applicants must additionally send hard-copy materials to the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) by no later than 5:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time on February 13, 2020. For full submission instructions, see the Round 5 AHSC Notice of Funding Availability. Awards to be announced in June 2020.
