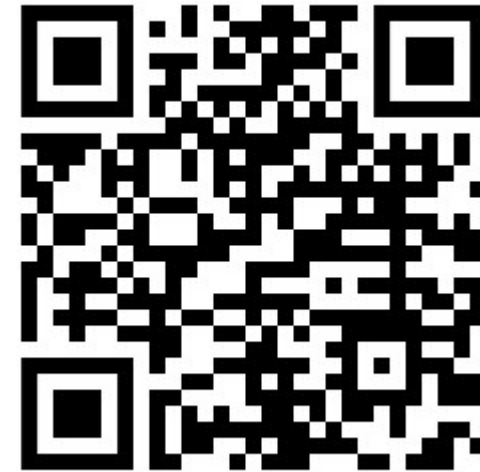

Metro is helping riders stay safe during extreme heat through the **Beat the Heat** campaign. Before your next trip, scan the QR code to access Metro's **Heat Awareness Guidebook**, where you can find cooling stations, hydration resources, heat safety tips and information about signing up for heat and weather alerts.

This guide is especially helpful if you are riding during the hottest part of the day, transferring between buses or trains, attending a major event or traveling with children, older adults or anyone more sensitive to heat. The information is available online and can be translated into multiple languages using the page's translation feature.

Take a minute before you travel: scan the code, review nearby cooling and hydration resources, sign up for alerts and plan your trip with heat safety in mind. Staying informed can help you ride Metro more comfortably and safely during hot weather.

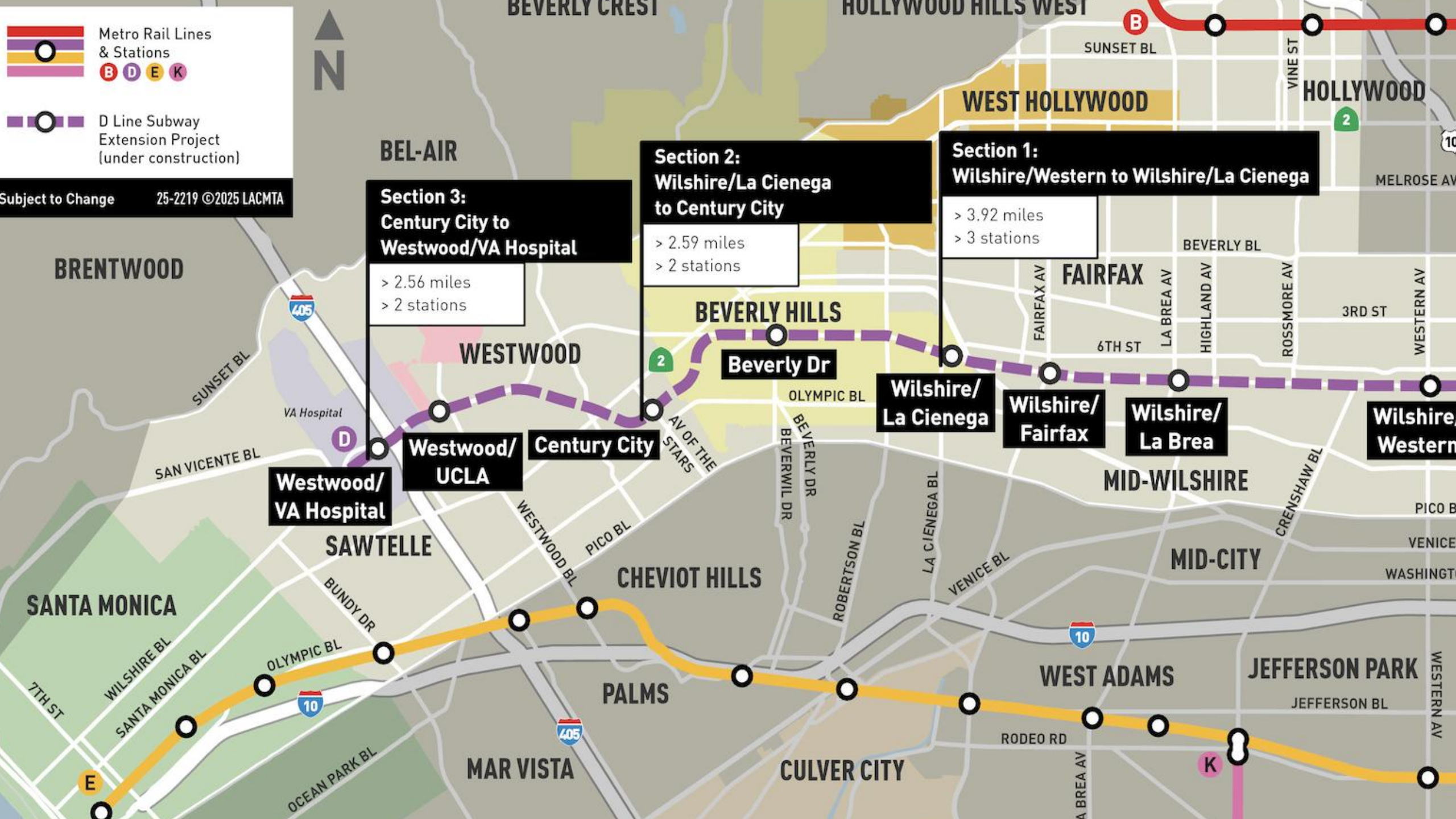

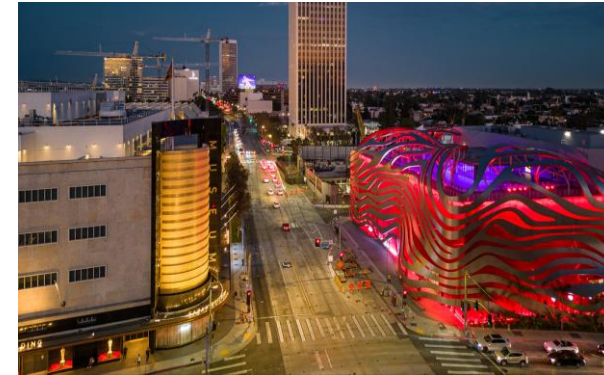

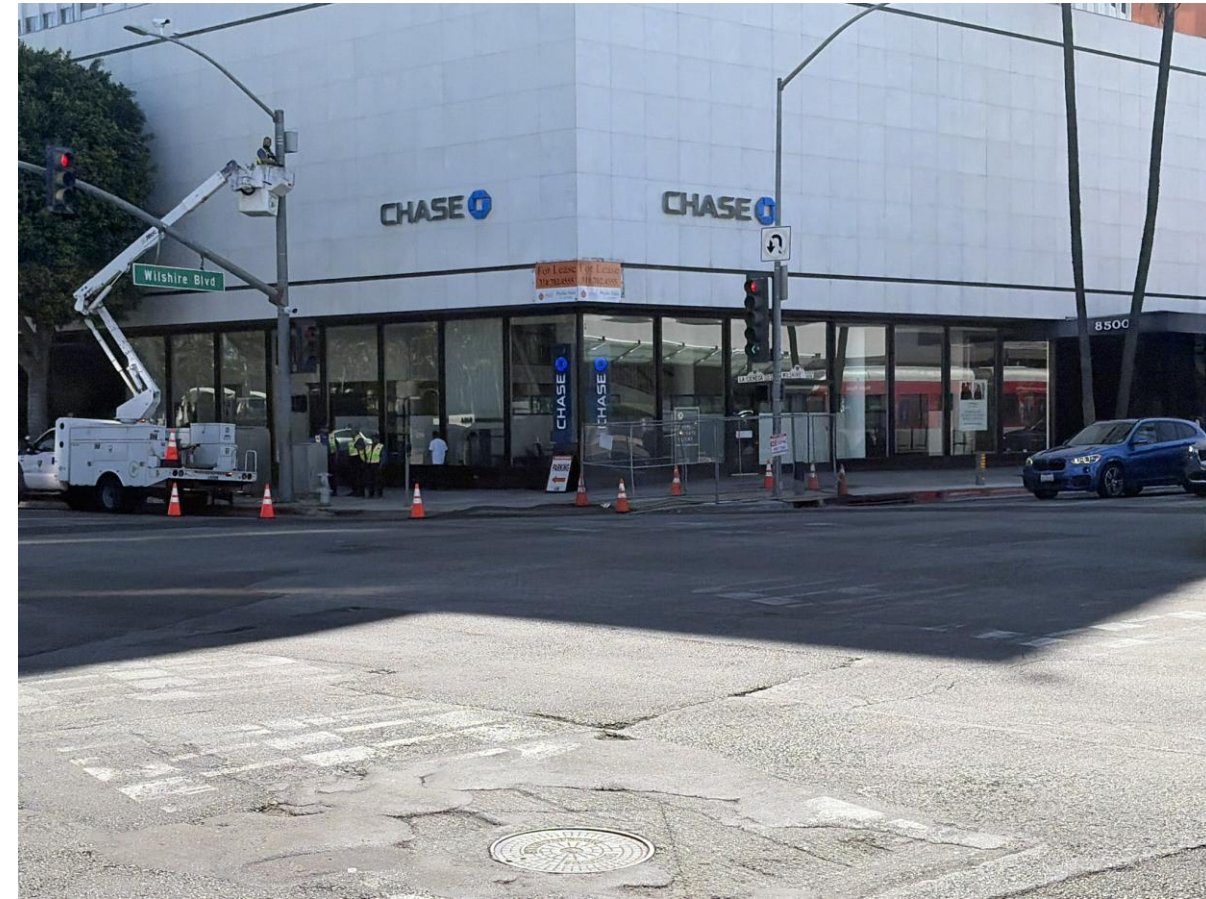

> **Summer/Fall 2026 (June – September*)**

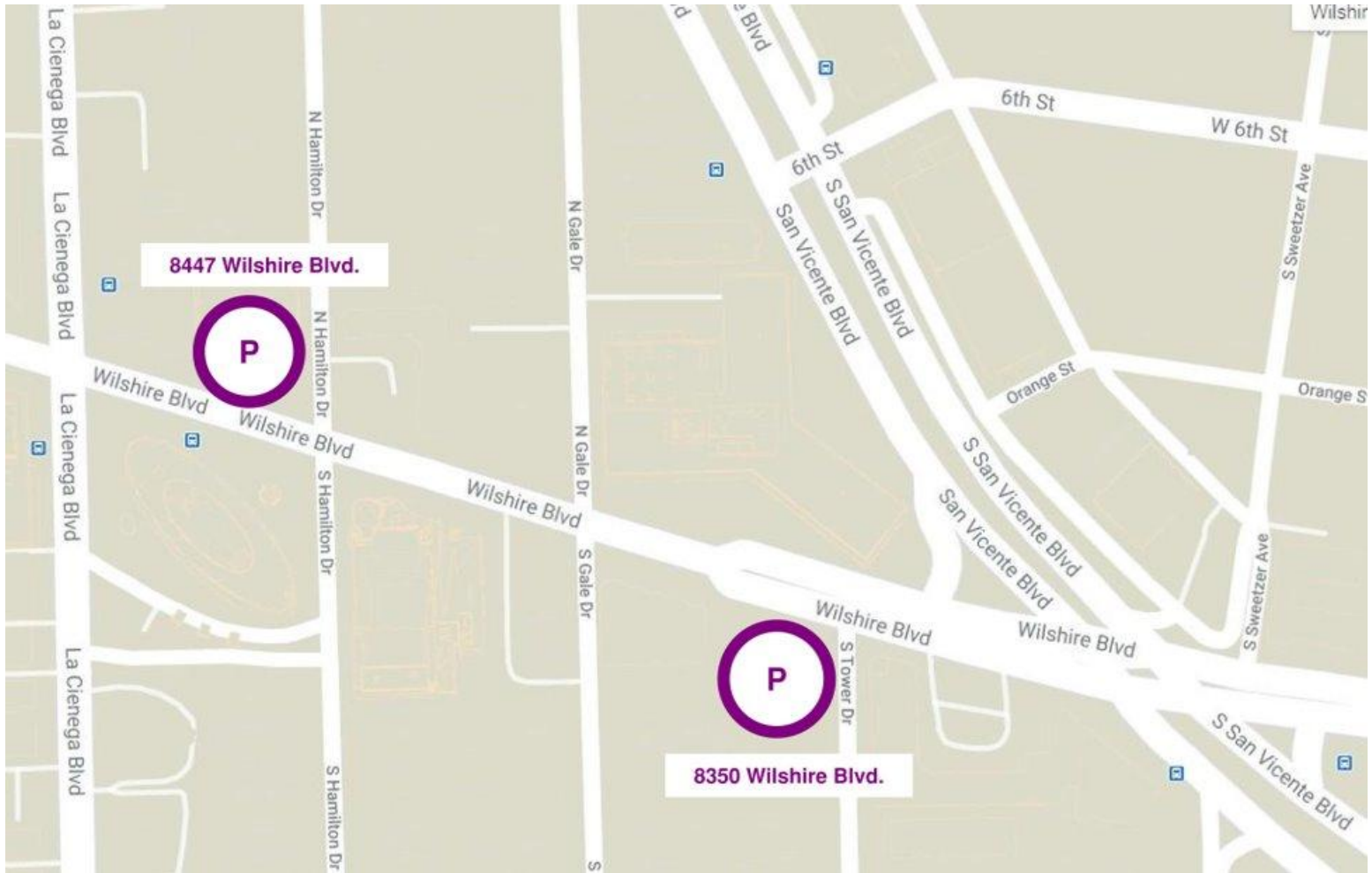

Instrumentation & Punchlist Work

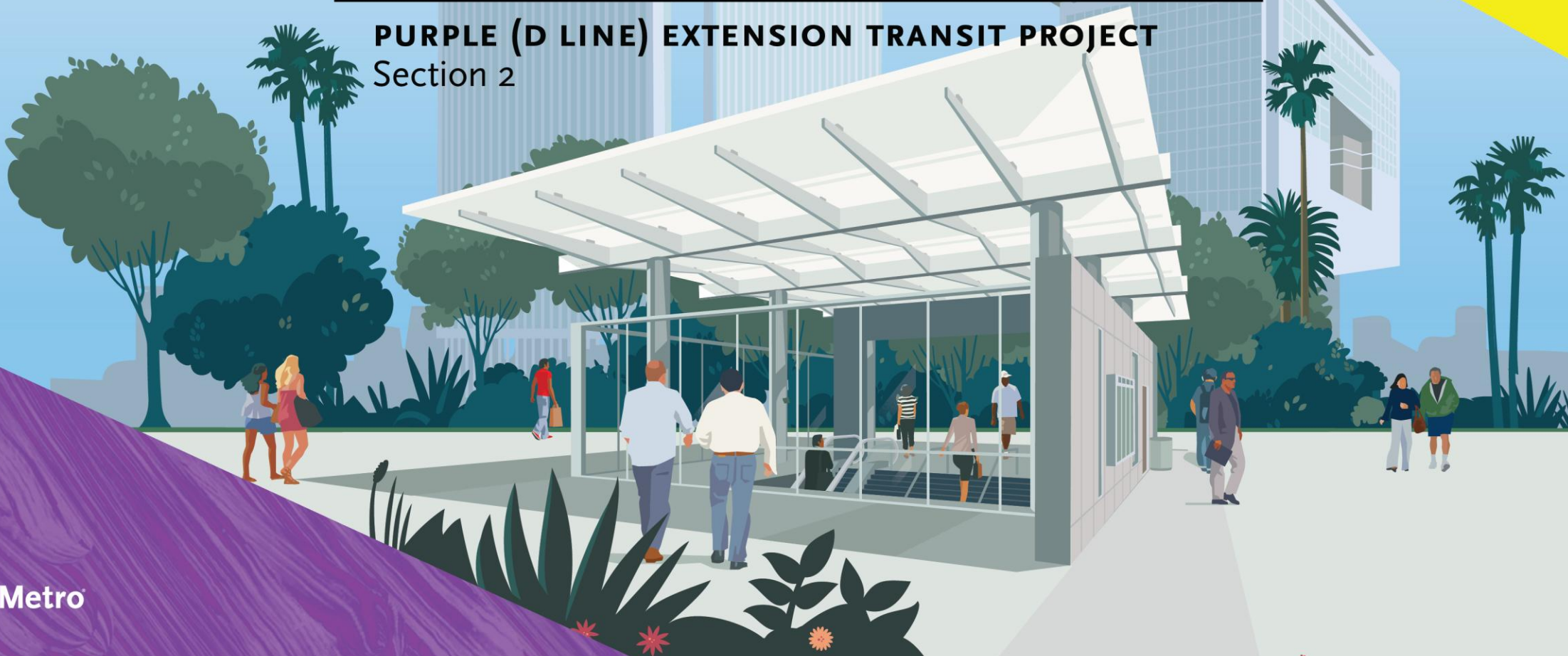
- > **When:** Ongoing
- > **Traffic Controls:**
 - Intermittent lane reductions on Wilshire Bl, La Cienega Bl, and side streets during off-peak hours will be in place to support the **removal** of geotechnical instruments in the Wilshire Bl and La Cienega Bl area.
 - Intermittent lane reductions may be in place on Wilshire Bl, west of La Cienega Bl, to support survey and street maintenance work under Wilshire Bl.

Section 2 of the Metro D Line Subway Extension expands high-capacity subway service into Beverly Hills and Century City, improving access to two of the Westside's most active commercial and employment centers. Metro is providing a fast, reliable alternative to congested corridors, it is reducing travel times, enhancing regional connectivity, and supporting economic activity for businesses, workers, and visitors.

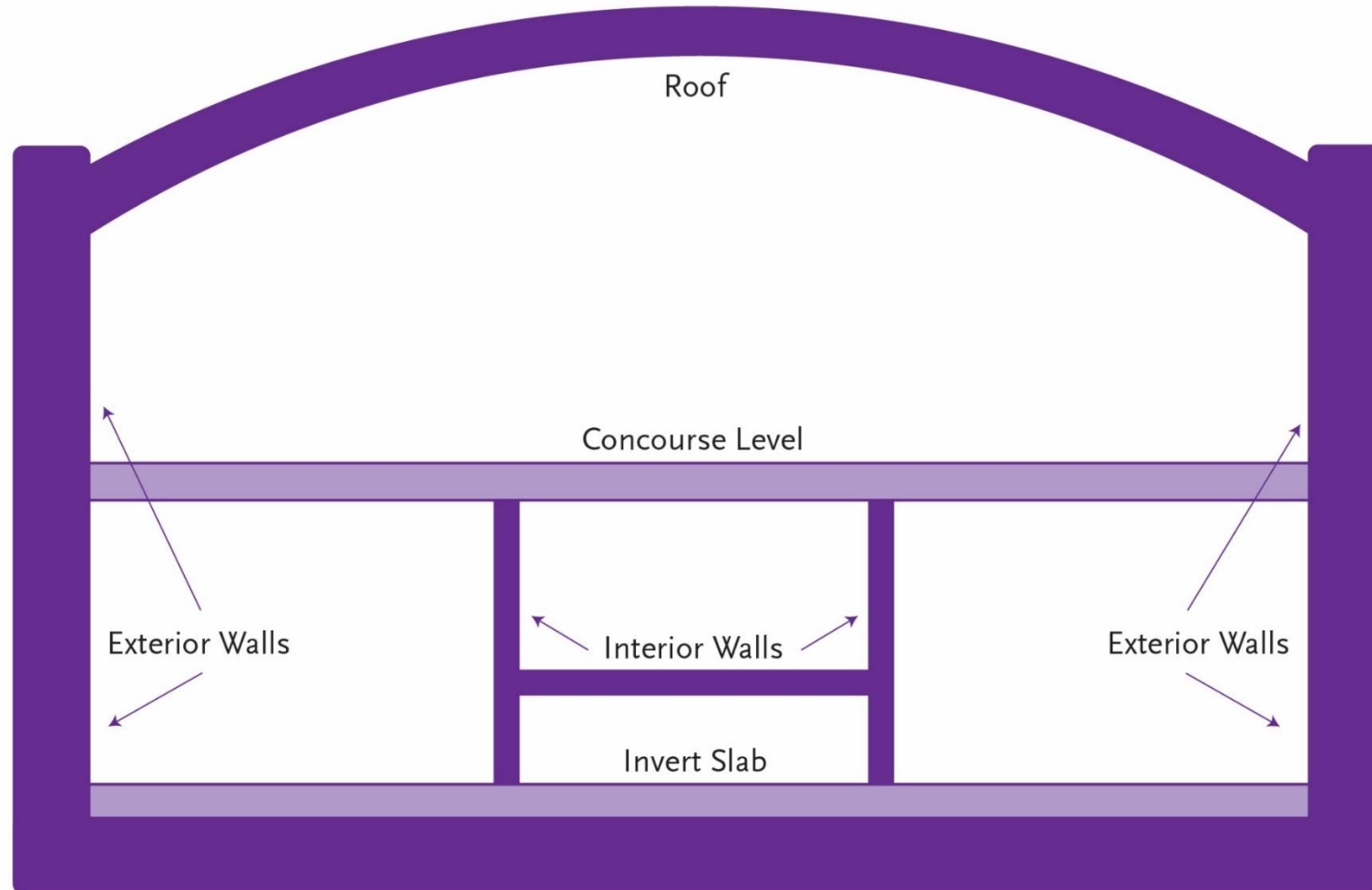

Current Work: Beverly Drive Station Entrance Construction Update

- > Completion of the point-supported glass system and terrazzo tile installation at the station entrance
- > Installation of Elevator entrances, doors, and fixtures
- > Installation of the concourse storefront at Elevator, Topping slab placement at the track/platform level
- > Drop ceiling installation in the east concourse

Current Work: Wilshire South Sidewalk Curb and Gutter

The contractor is working on curb, gutter, and sidewalk restoration work along the south side of Wilshire Bl between Crescent Dr and El Camino Dr. This work will be completed in sections and will require sidewalk demolition. Temporary walkways will be installed to maintain pedestrian access during construction activities.

Work Hours:

- Daytime Work Hours: 7am-4pm (Permitted noisy activities performed from 9am-4pm)
- Nighttime Work Hours: 8:15pm-4:30am

Traffic Controls

- Pedestrian access will be maintained during work activity.
- Driveway impacts on Wilshire Bl will be coordinated in advance with impacted stakeholders

Current Work: Equipment Decommission Work

The contractor will perform equipment decommission work along Wilshire Bl at various locations between Le Doux Rd and N Doheny Dr from Monday, May 11 through Monday, May 25. Intermittent lane closures and lane tapers for westbound and eastbound Wilshire Bl traffic will be required depending on the work location.

Work Hours:

- Daytime Work Hours: 9am to 4pm between N Clark Dr and N Doheny Dr
- Nighttime Work Hours: 8:15pm to 7am

Traffic Controls

- Intermittent lane closures and lane tapers on Wilshire Blvd will be in place between Le Doux Rd and N Doheny Dr

Current Work: AKA Alley Asphalt Demo, Removal, and Restoration Work

The contractor will be performing demolition, removal, and restoration work in the AKA alley (between N Canon Dr and N Crescent Dr) throughout the month of May. From Monday, May 11 through Wednesday, May 20 the contractor will close the AKA alley for alley improvement activities.

Work Hours:

- Daytime Work Hours: 7am-4:30pm
- Noise-generating activities, including pavement breaking and removals, will begin at 9AM during demolition work

Traffic Controls

- The AKA alley will be closed to support alley improvement activities from the alley approach at Wilshire Bl to approximately 180 feet north, at the end of the Canon Yard Wall.
- Partial access to the AKA's driveway for monthly parking in the alley will be maintained during the closure.
- Access to the alley will remain via Clifton Way

Current Work: Maybourne Alley Asphalt Demo, Removal, and Restoration Work

The contractor will close the Maybourne alley to perform asphalt demolition, removal activities, and restoration work throughout the month of May. From Wednesday, May 13 to Tuesday, May 19, the contractor will close the Maybourne alley for improvement activities.

Work Hours:

- Daytime Work Hours: 7am-4:30pm
- Noise-generating activities, including pavement breaking and removals, will begin at 9am during demolition work

Traffic Controls

- The Maybourne alley will be closed at Wilshire Bl during work activities from the alley driveway to approximately 50 feet north of Wilshire Bl.

Metro Business Interruption Fund (BIF)

The BIF currently provides financial assistance to small "mom and pop" businesses located along:

- **D Line Extension Sections 1, 2, & 3**
 - **With the opening of D Line Extension Section 1, grants will be awarded up to six months for impacts that occurred during construction activities.**
- **East San Fernando Valley Light Rail Transit Project**

Past BIF Eligible Projects include:

- **Crenshaw/LAX Transit Project****
- **Regional Connector Project, Little Tokyo area** & 2nd/Broadway Segment***

*BIF Eligibility ended June 2017.

**BIF Eligibility ended December 2023.

BIF Eligibility Requirements:

- **Businesses must be located immediately adjacent to the rail corridor for at least two years.**
- **Have 25 or fewer full-time employees.**
- **Other eligibility requirements as applicable.**

Grant amounts are determined by revenue loss directly related to the period of Metro construction disruption with a maximum of \$60,000 per impact year.



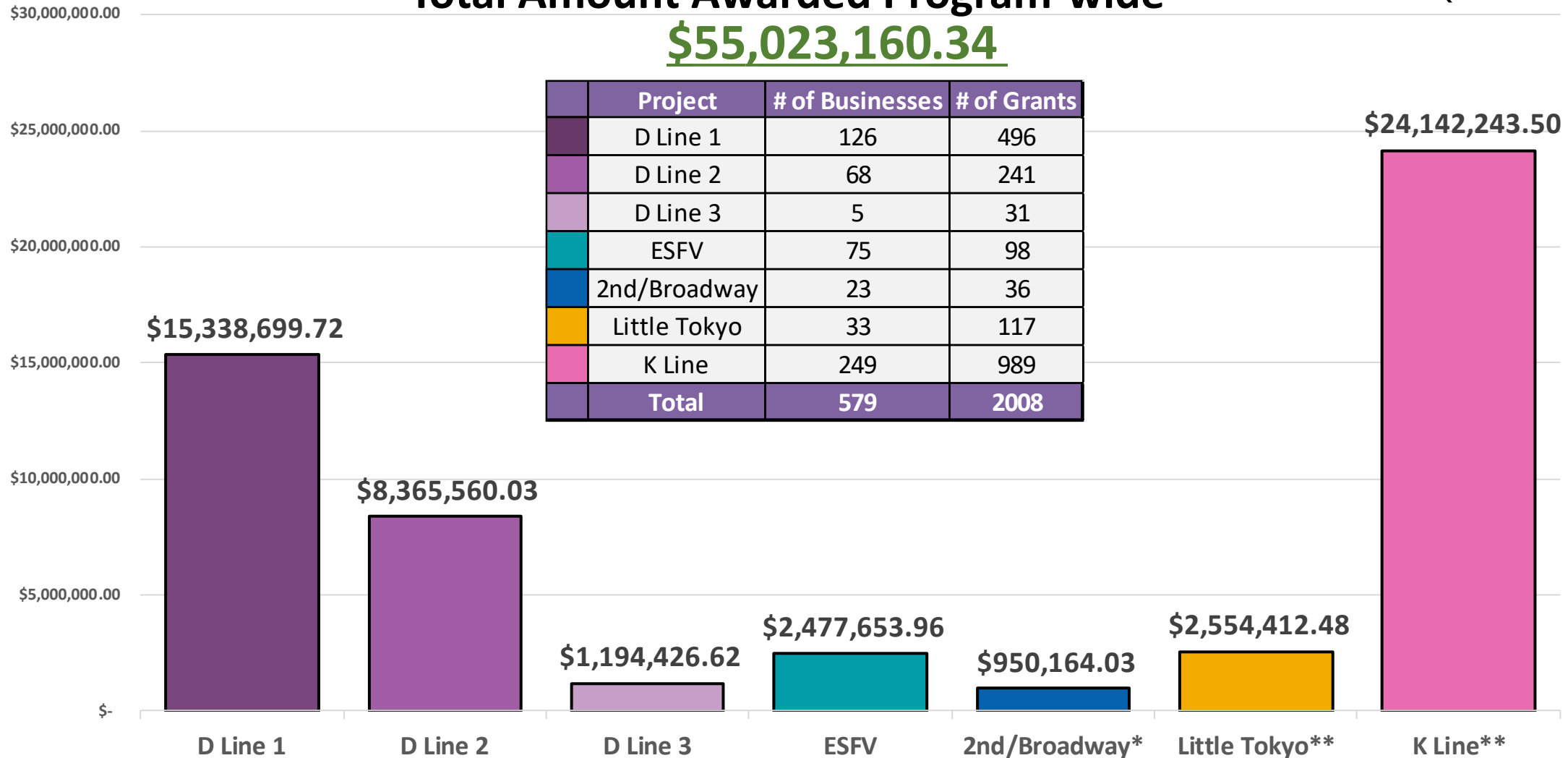

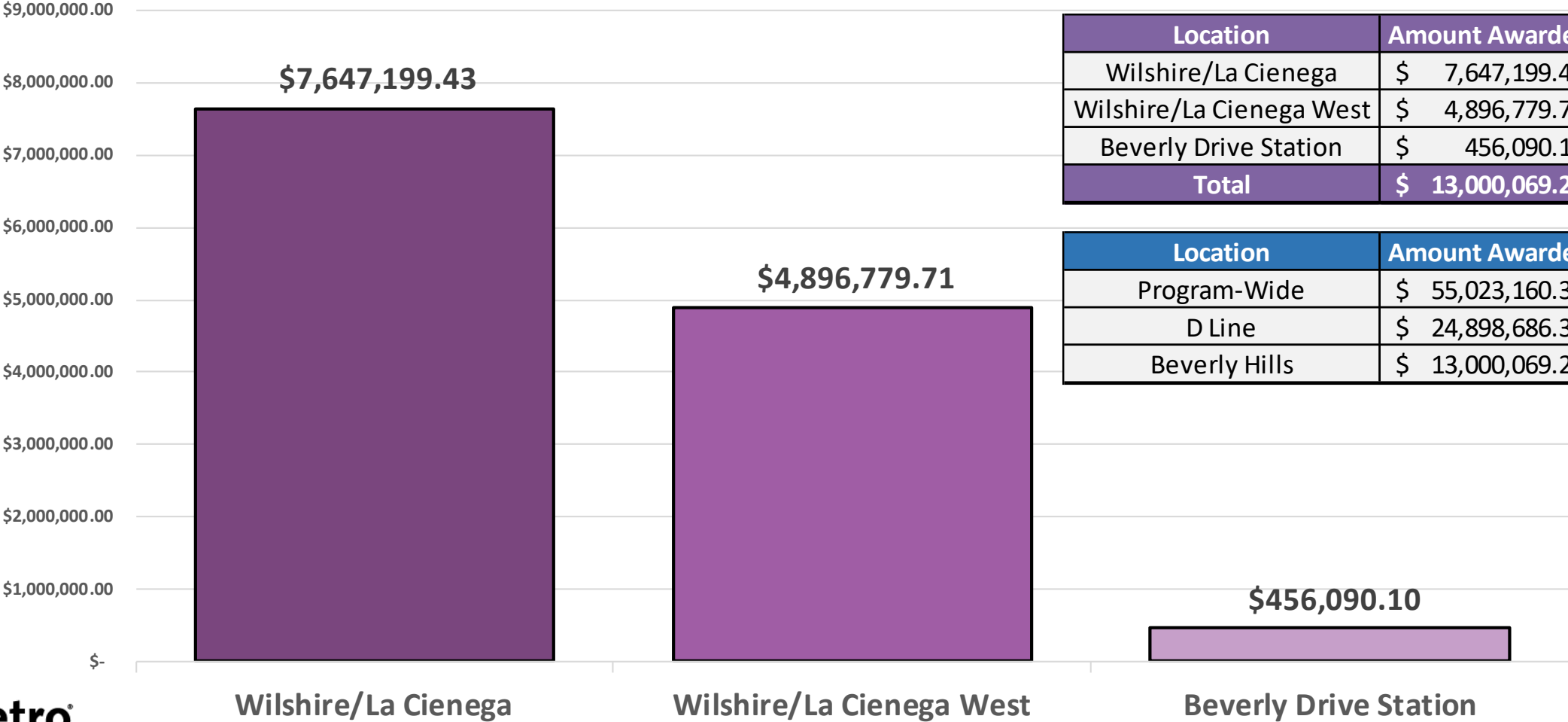
