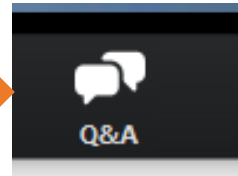

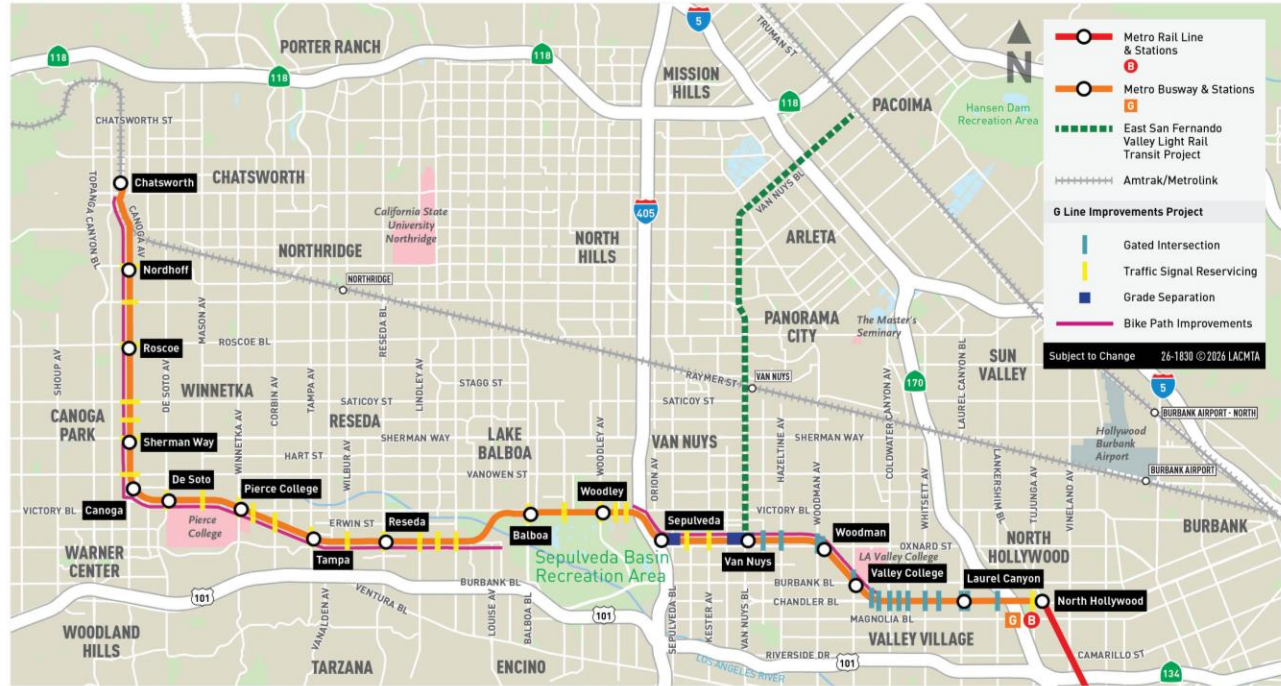

- Sepulveda Transit Corridor Project



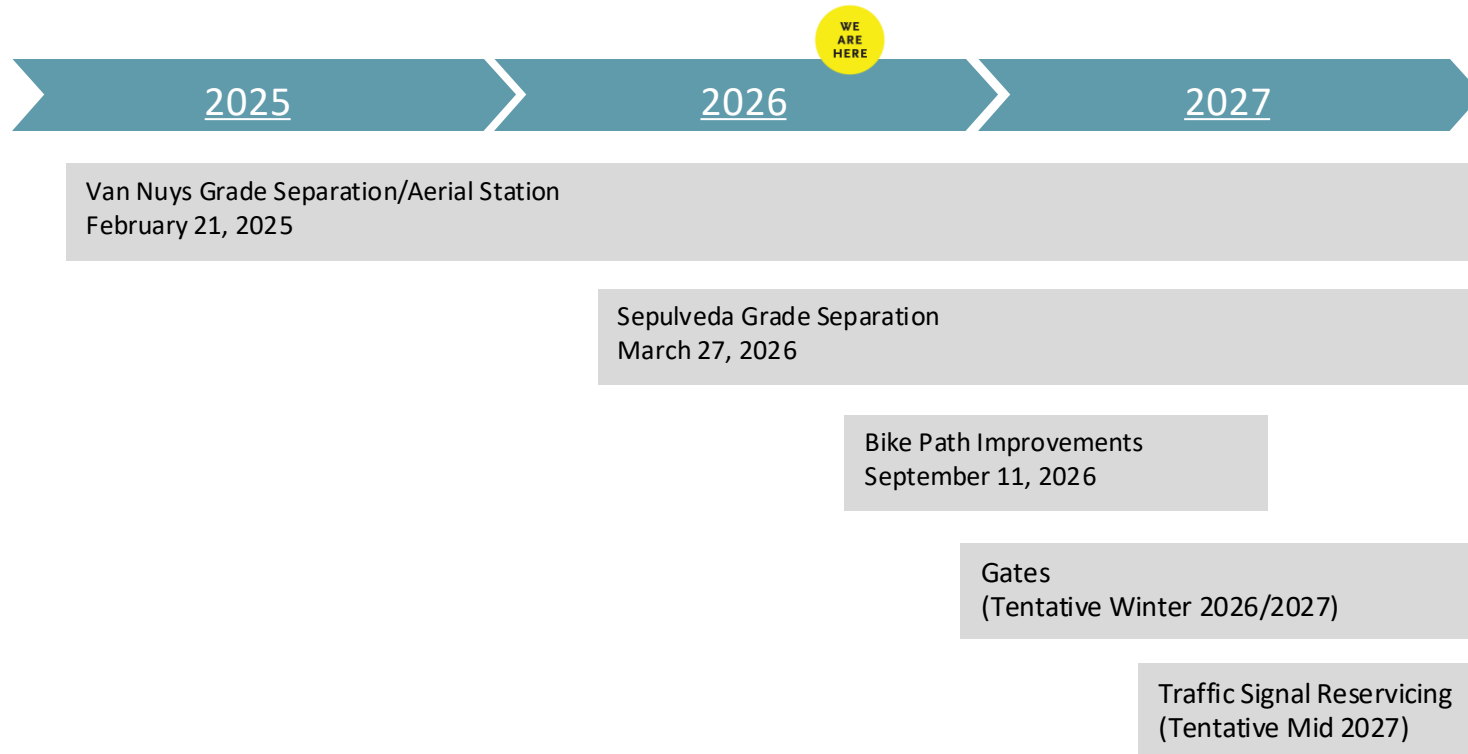
Connecting the World to the 2028 Summer Olympic Games

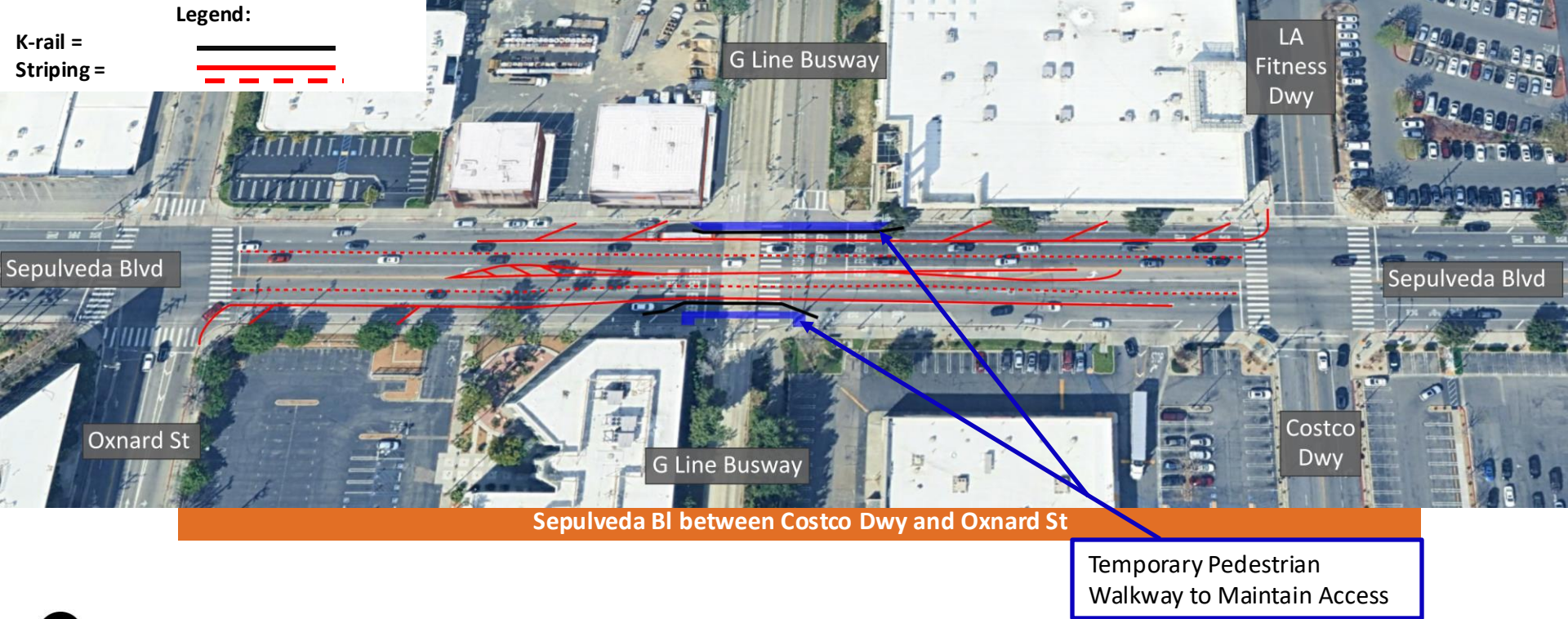

Van Nuys Bl and Sepulveda Bl Bridge

Activity: Valley Transit Partners (VTP) continues to work on the Van Nuys Bl Bridge and began construction of the Sepulveda Bl Bridge in March 2026.

Anticipated Completion: December 2027

Current Impacts

- Van Nuys and Sepulveda Station are temporarily closed
- Temporary Sepulveda bus stop is operating within the Park & Ride lot
- Haskell Av is closed to vehicular traffic
- Partial parking remains available



Current Detours

- G Line buses are detoured on Oxnard St between Woodman Av and the temporary bus stop on Erwin St
- G Line bike path is closed between Tyrone Av and Sepulveda Station
 - Follow posted bike detour signage via Calvert St, Delano St and Erwin St

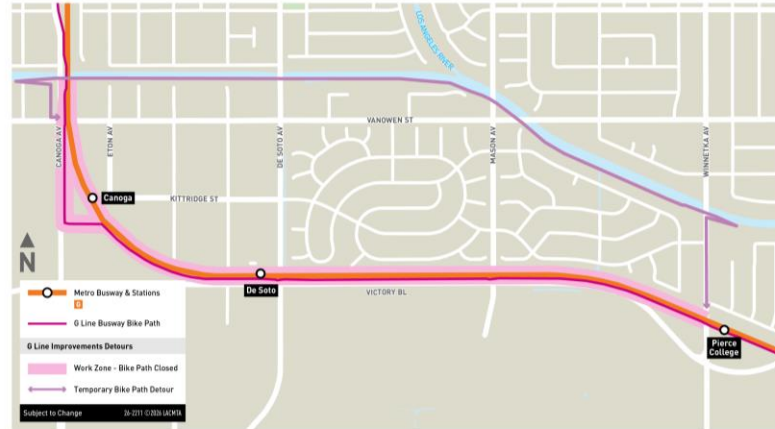
Current Construction: Multi-Use Path Improvements

Activity: Valley Transit Partners (VTP) began multi-use path improvements on September 11, 2026

Construction Work Hours: 7 AM to 5 PM, M-F

Current Detours

- Canoga Av–Winnetka Av
 - Bike path users are detoured to the LA River Greenway
 - Anticipated completion: November 2026
- White Oak Av–Sepulveda Basin
 - Bicyclists are detoured to Oxnard St
 - Temporary signage and shared-lane markings guide the route
 - Motorists should expect to share the travel lane with bicyclists
 - Anticipated completion: 3 weeks



Multi-Use Path Improvements

Path Improvements

- Resurfaced bike path
- Updated striping and pavement markings
- Enhanced lighting
- Improved wayfinding and safety signage

Bike Parking Enhancements

- New bike racks planned at:
Nordhoff St, Roscoe Bl, De Soto Av, Pierce College, Tampa Av, Reseda Bl, Balboa Bl, Woodley Av, Woodman Av, and Valley College

Additional Bike Amenities

- Bike lockers at Sherman Way
- New bike hub at Van Nuys Station



Upcoming Construction: Gated Intersections



Gated Intersection Status

Completed Work

- Pilot Gate testing completed 2025
- May 2026, VTP concluded potholing, which was necessary to verify the exact location and depth of underground utilities in advance of future gate installation.

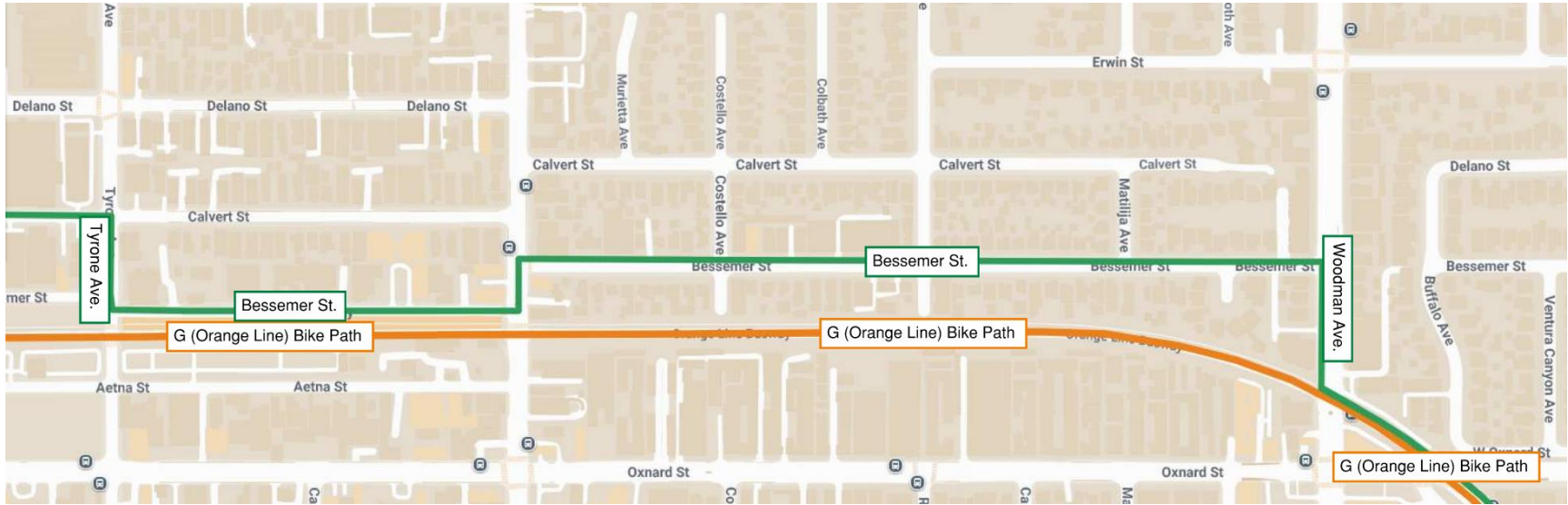
Design Updates

- 100% design near completion
- Coordination with 3rd Parties and Authorities having Jurisdiction will continue through final design
 - Including required utility relocations identified during potholing



Gated Intersections Detour

- Bike Path closure extended east from Tyrone Av to Woodman Av
- Anticipated December 2026 – December 2027



Metro Art

Metro Art Policy allocates 0.5% of transit construction costs for public art for the project

- At Stations:
 - Existing stations – Artwork repairs
 - New Van Nuys Station - artwork procurement
- On Board:
 - Art posters featuring neighborhoods served by Metro through the eyes of artists
 - Panorama City poster now available for free at all Metro Customer Centers
 - Poster signing with artist Mel Paz held September 12

How We Keep Communities Informed

Metro provides construction information through multiple communication channels to reach people who live, work, travel and operate businesses along the project corridor.

Construction Notices

Advance information about upcoming construction activities, work hours, closures, detours and anticipated impacts.

Direct Outreach

Canvassing and direct coordination with businesses, residents and other stakeholders near active construction areas when appropriate.

Community Outreach

Regular participation in neighborhood council meetings, community events, pop-up information tables and project update meetings.

Digital Updates

Project website updates, email notifications, e-newsletters and social media communications.

Outreach methods and notification areas vary depending on the location, type and anticipated impacts of the work.

What to Expect as Construction Progresses

1. Upcoming Work Is Identified

The project team reviews upcoming construction activities, schedules, traffic changes and anticipated community impacts.

2. Construction Information Is Shared

Metro provides information about upcoming work through appropriate outreach channels, which may include construction notices, email updates, website and social media posts, canvassing, stakeholder coordination and community meetings.

3. Metro Remains Available During Construction

The Community Relations team monitors community concerns, coordinates with the project team and provides additional information as construction progresses.

Construction schedules and activities are subject to change. Metro will continue to provide updates as information becomes available.

Managing Construction Impacts

Construction in an active transportation corridor requires temporary changes. The project team plans and coordinates work to maintain access and reduce disruption where feasible.

Access & Mobility

Maintain pedestrian, bicycle, business and property access where feasible and provide signed detours when temporary closures are required.

Traffic Management

Coordinate traffic control, lane closures, detours and construction sequencing to safely accommodate construction activities.

Construction Coordination

Coordinate work activities and schedules across the project to identify potential impacts and opportunities to reduce disruption where feasible.

Community Coordination

Provide advance information about significant construction activities and evaluate site-specific concerns that arise during construction.

Not all construction impacts can be avoided, but Metro works to provide clear information and implement reasonable mitigation measures where feasible.
